## EYFS Acceptable Use Policy (AUP)

## Rationale

In line with the School's Mission Statement we aim to help students develop their gifts and talents: spiritual and social; intellectual and emotional; aesthetic and physical through the provision of a broad and balanced curriculum, which is responsive to, and supportive of, their needs and aspirations, fosters intellectual curiosity and academic achievement, and motivates them to grow to their full potential. Our Mission Statement is distilled into our Vision Statement, and our aim is to develop our children, pupils and students so that they have "Strength of Mind, Strength of Values, Strength of Purpose".

As part of our on-going commitment to E-Safety we would appreciate it if the parents of the Nursery children could read through the following and, when appropriate, have a conversation with their child about E-Safety. Nursery children will use ICT as part of the curriculum and have access to the internet; however, it will always be in a supervised environment. Similarly, children may have accesses to devices at home. As a consequence of this, it is important to us that children are made aware of how to use devices safely.

In the Nursery, e-safety forms part of the curriculum and children are made aware of how to stay safe on the internet, in a way that is appropriate for their age. When your child is in Key Stage 1, both parents and children are asked to adhere to the rules listed below. As nursery parents, we would like you to be aware of these rules.

## **Key Stage 1 AUP**

I agree to use the school ICT system sensibly for the safety of myself and for others.

- I will only change my password when told to by a teacher.
- I will only use the computers for my school work unless permission is received from a teacher.
- I will use the internet safely and tell a trusted adult if I am worried about anything.
- I will not share my password or username.

I understand that these rules are for when I am in School and that I must also be sensible at home when using any type of ICT.

I understand that if I break any of the above rules the following may happen:

- I may not be able to work on any of the School computers.
- My teacher may have to speak to my parents.
